Beanie & Neck Warmer Easy Knitting

MEASUREMENTS

Years 2 (4-6/8/10-12/14)

Circumference (approx) 45 (47-50-52) cm

YARN (We suggest using the yarn stated to achieve the style pictured)

Primo 50g 1 (2-2-2) ball/s Main Colour (**M**); 1 ball Contrast Colour (**C**) for pom pom of Beanie.

NEEDLES AND EXTRAS

A 5mm circular needle or size needed to give correct tension; wool needle; medium size pom pom maker.

TENSION

15 sts to 10cm in width over stocking st, using 5mm needles.

To work a 13cm x 13cm tension square, using 5mm needles, cast on 18 sts. Work 13cm in stocking st, ending with a purl row. Cast off loosely.

If less sts use smaller needles, if more sts use larger needles.

ABBREVIATIONS

alt = alternate, **approx** = approximate, **beg** = beginning, **cm** = centimeters, **cont** = continue, **foll** = follow/ing, **K** = knit, **P** = purl, **rem** = remain/ing, **rep** = repeat, **RS** = right side, **st/s** = stitch/es, **stocking st** = 1 row K, 1 row P, **tog** = together, **WS** = wrong side.

BEANIE & NECK WARMER

Using 5mm circular needle and **M**, cast on 72 (76-80-84) sts.

Join to work in rounds, taking care not to twist cast on edge.

Place a marker to indicate beg of rounds.

Beg rib - 1st round - * K2, P2, rep from * to end.

Rep 1st round until neck warmer measures 16 (17-18-19) cm from beg.

Divide For Face Opening - Next round - Rib 16 (16-18-18), cast off next 38 (42-42-46) sts in rib, rib 18 (18-20-20).

Next round - Rib 16 (16-18-18), cast on 34 (38-38-42) sts and rib across these sts, rib to end = 68 (72-76-80) sts.

Cont in rib until work measures 18 (19-20-21) cm from beg.

Next round - Knit.

Rep last round until work measures 32 (34-36-38) cm from beg.

Next round - * K2tog, rep from * to end = 34 (36-38-40) sts.

Break off yarn leaving a long end. Run end through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

Using **C**, make a pom pom and attach to top of beanie as pictured.
